




#### to A Walk through the Bible,

# **BIBLE OVERVIEW**

The Bible is a group of 66 books written by various authors over a long period of time: 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 in the New Testament. The Old Testament starts with the Creation, the fall of man, and Noah's Ark. Additionally, it recounts God's choosing Abram (later called Abraham) to begin a nation, who will be known as Jews, Hebrews, or the Israelites. The Old Testament describes the rise of Israel only to fall when they neglect and disobey God. Prophets, kings, songs, and ordinary people such as Ruth, Job, and Esther tell the history of the chosen ones, and you will learn about these people as we progress through the Bible.

The New Testament contains the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John), which include Jesus' birth, teachings, miracles, death, and resurrection. The book of Acts and the epistles (letters) written by leaders of this newly formed faith portray the struggles and persecution the church endured. The last book (Revelation) foretells Jesus' return to earth to rescue all of his followers, so that we may live on the New Earth (Heaven) with Jesus for eternity.

#### "I have placed the rainbow in the clouds." (Genesis 9:13a NLT)


